(Romans 11:33)


He opens up the depths, tells secrets, sees in the dark-light spills out of him!

He waits to reveal insights and dimensions of truth to those who care enough to ponder, probe and examine.


God's ways are not discovered through normal, humanistic methods.

Don't know there is depth.


Don't know how to reach for depth.



Why am I so content with shallowness?


Don't want to dive.
